We ended off the day by watching the top ten competitors from the North Island compete in the third round of Brain Bee. I'm really glad I gave Brain Bee a shot and would recommend it to anyone who wants to know a bit more about how the brain works. Selected students will have their work exhibited at the Auckland Art Gallery in August- stay tuned and keep an eye on our art journey!




CAREER EXPO AT MOUNT ALBERT GRAMMAR TUESDAY 5TH AUGUST 4-7PM
