SCOOPING UP STATISTICS: YEAR 13 DIVE INTO HOKEY POKEY

This week our Year 13 Statistics students took part in a classic kiwi classroom activity- the Hokey Pokey Ice Cream Investigation. This hands-on task is a staple in New Zealand mathematics education, designed to explore probability, counting techniques, and systematic thinking through the sweet lens of hokey pokey ice cream: vanilla ice cream dotted with crunchy honeycomb toffee lumps.

What's the Scoop?

Students were given a simple but surprisingly rich challenge: count the number of hokey pokey lumps in each scoop. From there, they applied statistical tools to:

- Estimate averages and variation
- Model the lump counts using the **Poisson distribution**, ideal for discrete events occurring randomly over a fixed space (or scoop!)
- Explore sampling techniques
- · Discuss fairness and consistency in product packaging

It is a playful yet powerful way to connect abstract statistical concepts with real-world thinking and, yes, there was some taste-testing involved too!

Leadership in Action

We were especially proud to have our Head Boy and Head Girl join the investigation, modelling curiosity, collaboration, and a love of learning. Their presence reminded us that leadership is not just about speeches and service- it's also about rolling up your sleeves and engaging with the everyday moments that shape our school culture.

Why It Works

This activity is more than just counting lumps. It encourages students to:

- Think critically about randomness and variation
- Apply probability models to everyday contexts
- · Collaborate and communicate findings clearly
- · Reflect on how mathematics helps us make sense of the world, even the dessert aisle

Statistics at Elim: Fun, Relevant, and Real

At Elim Christian College Mt Albert, our Statistics programme is designed to be engaging, meaningful, and full of discovery. Whether we're modelling ice cream scoops, analysing survey data, or exploring real-world trends, our students learn to:

- · Ask thoughtful questions
- · Use data to tell compelling stories
- · Apply mathematical thinking to everyday life

We believe Statistics should be fun and interesting and this week's investigation proved just that. It's not just about numbers; it's about curiosity, creativity, and making sense of the world around us.
