Students also put their skills to the test in a Rubik's Cube tournament, where Kairos Tingson (Room 5) took first place with an impressive time of 19.56 seconds! Ruben Wysoski (Room 8) secured second place - despite having one arm in a cast - at 27.1 seconds, and Gideon Goh (Room 8) came third with 35.7 seconds.
