The Top Art Exhibition, organised by NZQA, showcases the best art produced by NCEA Level 3 Visual Arts students. It travels across various galleries, museums, and schools throughout New Zealand. This exhibition offers the public a chance to view the high caliber of student work, while also giving this year's Visual Arts students an opportunity to see what they can strive for to achieve Excellence in their own work.



"The theme of my work came from a place of uncertainty as to who I was and who I wanted to be. Throughout the boards I explored the pressure, expectations and emotions that overwhelmed me. The ideas in my work came from the emotions that I was feeling, identifying the problems I faced and discovering a way to journey through and away from these.

My works were created with graphite, coloured pencil and acrylic paint, as well as incorporating string, cloth, metal chain, impasto and gloss medium in particular compositions. The symbolism, colour, layering, composition and surrealism was inspired from many artist studies of their techniques." -Julia Davidson
