HEALTH AND SAFETY AT THE SCHOOL GATE

Thank you for your support and for making changes to your pick up and drop off routines. We would like to update you on this matter. The school has worked tirelessly over the past six years with Auckland Transport, families and the community to explore solutions to the traffic issues in the surrounding streets.

Here is what we have been doing:

- We have worked with Auckland Transport through their Travelwise program. Our teachers and students have promoted initiatives like 'Park and Walk', 'Slow Down Around Schools', 'Be Bright Be Seen' and many more.
- Making McLean Street one way, creating angle parks and having no parking on one side have all been ideas proposed by our leadership to Auckland Transport. Unfortunately none of these have been possible to date.
- We have had a crossing approved for McLean Street in previous years. However, funding was an issue resulting in this not being completed.
- This year, we have again reached out to Auckland Transport several times to revisit the school and support our students to be safer around the school. Reducing the speed around our school and limited parking zones are new ideas we can also present to Auckland transport when they are able to attend a site visit.
- Duty staff continue to ensure safety of students leaving school.
- We will be assisting senior students with a safe crossing in McLean Street and will show them a safe route to public transport using controlled crossings. We ask that junior students be crossed across McLean Street by parents if possible.
- We have been working with our proprietors on creating a new rear gate entrance for pedestrians from Allendale Road.
- We have asked parents to treat McLean Street as a one way. This has had a mostly positive uptake by our families but the public are still able to use this as a cut through, so this has not solved the gridlock.

What you can do:

- Use Allendale and McLean Streets as one way during peak times. Although we cannot ask the general public to do this, with our community all following this request the majority of traffic will be going the same way.
- We encourage you to park in surrounding roads as suggested in our Travelwise handouts and posters. This will help to ease the gridlock traffic situation at peak times.
- We ask you to drive cautiously and slowly around the surrounding areas, watching out for students and showing courtesy to other drivers. Please help our school to be positive light in our community through our road use.

EDUCATION OUTSIDE THE CLASSROOM (EOTC) BLANKET CONSENT REMINDER


Education Outside The Classroom (EOTC) is the name given to all events / activities that occur outside the classroom, both on and off the school site.
