This term our Biblical theme is **God wants us to celebrate life**. The Year 5-6 students will be working with Asian Mission Outreach to learn more about their programme and promote fundraising opportunities across the school. We will be focusing on Jesus as the Ultimate Leader during our Integrated Inquiry session, unpacking the example He set on earth and how we can imitate Him. During Scripture sessions, the Year 4 ākongā will learn more about the story of Isaac and Rebekah while the Year 5-6 ākongā will deepen their understanding of Jacob and Esau.

ACTION: Mission Minded Kids form (Year 5-6 only)

On the 8th, 14th and 15th of May, your child will participate in the Mission Minded Kids (MMK) course, run by Asian Outreach NZ. Over three, one-hour sessions, your child will learn about different cultures and standards-of-living around the world, their responsibility to be part of the Great Commission (making disciples) and what life is like for persecuted believers. HOME LEARNING: Guidelines for home learning are pasted into the students' home learning books. Students will receive a home learning sheet every week. Homework is due on Fridays. Included each week is a copy of the scripture focus and discussion prompts for families to use at home. Homework will include work that reinforces what

is happening in the classroom, including reading, maths and an optional extra activity.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION: Classes will have one session of physical education per week. Students are asked to wear sneakers for their session. They are encouraged to bring their PE uniforms for this and get changed using the school facilities.

DEVICES/ LEARNING PLATFORMS: Students from Year 4-6 are encouraged to bring a charged Chromebook to school every day. Some students in Year 5 and Year 6 may still be using an iPad as they are being phased out. Class Dojo is used to communicate notices with parents. More formal information will be sent through emails. Please ensure you have the Class Dojo notifications turned on. The students will use Google Classroom to post digital work.

KOTAHITANGA: Elim is a PB4L school (Positive Behaviour for Learning). Our classroom management systems are based on Elim Christian College Mount Albert values and uphold the special character of our school. We use a tino pai (traffic light system) to reward students based on the Kotahitanga values. The focus in Term 2 is Maia (courage) so students will be learning what courage looks like in various school settings. All students start on a green light and have the potential to move to the purple 'tino pai' light for outstanding behaviour. Any student not adhering to classroom expectations will receive an orange light warning (a chance to change their behaviour). If the behaviour continues, an orange light is given. Where there are patterns of negative behaviour, parents will be informed.

UNIFORM: During Term 2-3, students may choose to wear the winter uniform. This includes long-sleeved polo shirts and regulation track pants may be worn. Refer to the [school website](#) for requirements or the Elim uniform [handbook](#) page. Please ensure that all items are **clearly named**.

WASTE MANAGEMENT AND MINIMISATION: All students are required to take their morning-tea and lunch wrappers, uneaten food, etc. home with them. They cannot dispose of it at school. The recycling bins at Elim Christian College Mount Albert have little provision for landfill items and food scraps. We would still like to strongly encourage all our parents to pack lunches in reusable containers and to buy in bulk.

AFTER SCHOOL CARE: Carpe Diem Kids provides after-school care off-site. Students are collected from school and taken to another school for after school care. More Information about this service can be accessed via their website - <https://carpediemkids.co.nz/>

BLANKET CONSENT: Education Outside The Classroom (EOTC) is the name given to all events / activities that occur outside the classroom, both on and off the school site. This blanket consent will be sought at the beginning of each year for every student Year 1-13. Fill out [the form](#) for each child in your family attending Elim Christian College Mt Albert if you have not completed it yet.

PARENT HELP: The school operates on the Ministry of Education's best practice. We have class trips and activities planned for this year. These cannot go ahead if the adult to child ratio is not met. All volunteers are required to hold a current police clearance. This clearance needs to be with Elim Christian College Mount Albert. If you are unsure of your current police vetting status, please check with our admin staff. If you are not police-vetted via our school as yet, please note that this takes a few weeks to process.

We have an open-door policy. Teachers are in staff devotions until 8:30 am. They are available in their classroom to answer questions and to chat about minor issues from 8:30 am – 8:40 am and again after school. Alternatively, if you would like the time to talk further, please make an appointment with the teacher. They will be more than happy to discuss the matter with you.
