Welcome to Term 3. We hope that you have had an amazing holiday with your family and friends.

This term our Biblical theme is **God helps us grow and change.** Year 7-8 students will explore the idea that God desires us to develop resilience and patience as we grow and change. Our Christian Living unit will focus on Paul, highlighting his dedication as a diligent follower of Jesus and his significant role in spreading the gospel in the New Testament. In Social Studies, we will continue to emphasise Pukuahuwhenua (Diligence) through our Pioneers unit.

DEVICES/ LEARNING PLATFORMS: Students are required to bring a **fully charged** and **named** laptop/chrome book to school each day. Google Classroom is used to communicate within the classroom and share digital work. Ipads are not suitable at this level as the devices must have a keyboard attached.

HOMEWORK: Students will receive a homework sheet every week. Homework is due on Fridays. Homework will include work that reinforces what is happening in the classroom, including memory verse, reading, grammar/punctuation, social studies and maths.

MEDICAL / CHANGE OF ADDRESS: Please send any changes in details, such as medical information, address or phone numbers to office@elimmtalbert.school.nz.

WASTE MANAGEMENT AND MINIMISATION: All students are required to take their morning-tea and lunch wrappers, uneaten food, etc. home with them. They cannot dispose of it at school. The recycling bins at our school have little provision for landfill items and food scraps. We would still like to strongly encourage all our parents to pack lunches in reusable containers and to buy in bulk.

AFTER SCHOOL CARE: Carpe Diem Kids provides after-school care off-site. Students are collected from school and taken to another school for after school care. More Information about this service can be accessed via their website. https://carpediemkids.co.nz/

UNIFORM: During Term 2-3, students may choose to wear the winter uniform. This includes the Elimg logo v-neck black knit jumper and school jackets. BLANKET CONSENT: Education Outside The Classroom (EOTC) is the name given to all events / activities that occur outside the classroom, both on and off the school site. This blanket consent will be sought at the beginning of each year for every student Year 1-13.
